Requirements and Further Information

Title and professional affiliation(s) of author.

Text: 1000-1500 words max, 1.5 spacing, Times New Roman.

References: All references should be footnoted, please keep references to a minimum.

Images: Please attach a headshot image which will be included for the blog author.

Each blog requires at least **one** image to accompany the main text. It is essential that you have **received permission** to use these images or that images are **royalty free**. The IHA cannot take responsibility for any **copyright infringement** related to your blog.

Include full references and copyright information for images separately. All images must be of high resolution, and the primary image must be 520px width x 248px height.

Copyright free images can be sourced at a number of websites including: Wikimedia Commons; National Gallery of Ireland Creative Commons; Library of Congress; Unsplash; Flickr and Pixabay. In all cases, it is the responsibility of the author to double check if the image chosen is royalty free and that the appropriate attribution and licensing links are cited.

Images produced through AI are not accepted on the IHA website.
